ViaWare SPS (Small Parcel Shipping) fulfills your parcel manifesting requirements and produces all the required carrier compliant labels for your small parcel shipments.

ViaWare SPS services all ViaWare transactions from an unattended rate server and automates the parcel rating process for all domestic shipments. If unique conditions exist, there is also an attended station for manual entry of non-standard shipments.

ViaWare SPS can be expanded to meet increases in order volume and provides the necessary rating, labeling, and electronic reporting features for managing your small parcel shipments.

Rates and Compliant Labeling

ViaWare SPS will search pre-determined rate tables for your selected carrier and will use weight and carrier information to rate each of your parcels. ViaWare SPS supports a number of carriers, including:

- FedEx
- UPS
- DHL/Airborne
- BAX
- USPS (United States Postal Service)

Reporting

With ViaWare SPS, you can generate reports for the activity of the current or any previous day's small parcel shipping. Carrier-compliant manifest reports include a detailed list of all processed transactions. Transactions are itemized on the manifest and include all the needed information.

ViaWare SPS can also be used to implement special EDI (Electronic Data Interchange) programs and transmit electronic revenue files to the appropriate carrier.

Simplified Shipping

ViaWare SPS smoothes your shipping process with automated rating, compliant labeling, and electronic reporting. As part of the integrated ViaWare Suite, SPS gives you the functionality needed to simplify your small parcel shipping process.

With ViaWare SPS, users can generate reports for the activity of the current or any previous day's small parcel shipping. Carrier manifest reports are formatted according to specifications of the respective carriers and include a detailed list of all processed transactions. Transactions are itemized on the manifest, and include package ID, zip, zone, weight, and charges. Accumulated totals for number of packages, weight, and charges are included as well.
